Dale K. Nesbary, Ph.D. is serving in his 13th year as President of Muskegon Community College. Since his appointment in 2009, for the first time in its 96 year history, MCC has been named best community college in Michigan, in 2017 by BestColleges.com and in 2021 by Intelligent.com. Moreover, the College raised \$21 million in grants and gifts, in support of a \$55 million infrastructure investment, the largest since locating to its main campus in 1967. These include our \$14.1 million Health and Wellness Center, built from the ground up as a working emergency hospital and housing a community facing health clinic, both of which were placed in service during the recent COVID-19 pandemic. The College boasts many sterling academic programs including a perennially nationally ranked nursing program, and two performance groups (West Michigan Concert Winds and the MCC Collegiate Singers) having recently performed in the Isaac Stern Auditorium of New York's famed Carnegie Hall. Moreover.

- MCC was named a Top 50 Best Value Community College for 2016 (valuecolleges.com), the number one college in Michigan by Best Colleges.com in 2017, and Intelligent.com in 2021.
- MCC state-of-the-art Science Center, a life and physical sciences building opened in August 2015, will serve our campus and business community for decades to come.
- MCC Sturuss Technology Center, an adaptive reuse of the former Muskegon Chronicle and Masonic Temple buildings, opened in January 2018 and houses applied technology, entrepreneurial studies and experiential learning in the heart of historic downtown Muskegon.
- MCC Health and Wellness Center, which serves our growing Medical Assistant program, our Health, Physical Education and Recreation Department curriculum, a Mercy Health Partners primary care clinic opened in January 2019.
- MCC Art and Music Building opened in August 2019 in the former Technology Building space on the main campus.
- A comprehensive Student Success and Completion Agenda was implemented that includes early engagement initiatives, college readiness and completion components resulting in an increase in MCC's graduation rate by seven percent.

- Extension centers in Ottawa and Newaygo Counties were opened.
- Over 30 new academic and technical programs were developed including entrepreneurial studies, medical assistant, medical billing and coding, instrumental music, alternative/renewable energy, autism and social coaching, robotics, high speed fabrication, undergraduate research, film production, and many others.
- The West Michigan Concert Winds, an MCC instrumental ensemble, performed in Carnegie Hall in 2016 and the Collegiates vocal ensemble performed in Carnegie Hall in 2017.
- Multiple integrated strategic plans were launched and completed.
- Athletic programs added include men's and women's cross country, bowling and soccer. MCC now offers more athletic programming than any other community college in Michigan and boasts national accolades in each sport.
- Strategic relationships have been expanded with many school districts, universities, businesses, and civic organizations.
- Professional training and apprenticeship programs are maintained with 150 West Michigan businesses.
- Collaborative agreements have been signed with international educational partners in Germany, Belize, and Nevis.
- Concurrent enrollment and related agreements with 4-year partners have been signed with Western Michigan University, Ferris State University, Michigan State University, Grand Valley State University, and many others.
- MCC was selected as an Achieving the Dream Leader College, part of a competitive, multi-year national initiative to help increase student success.
- Early College initiatives were launched to serve students in Muskegon, Ottawa and Newaygo counties. We are now seen as a statewide leader in this area after initiating MCC programs in 2011.
- Full 10-year reaccreditation was attained in 2010 by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges & Schools.
- Two \$500,000 grants for talent development were awarded to MCC, one of which partnered with nationally respected institutions.
- MCC's 40+ year old planetarium was upgraded through fundraising to state-of-the-art status.
